EAGLE FEATHER

It symbolizes respect, honour, strength, courage and wisdom. In Saskatchewan, the eagle feathers also symbolize a step forward, a new chapter in the story of reconciliation.

Ceremonial and Academic Meaning: Eagle feathers are given at high honours. Many tribes give eagle feathers to their members at graduation to signify the successful completion of this important educational journey and the honour the graduate brings to their family, community and tribal nation.

Feathers are a powerful symbol of hope and spiritual growth. They symbolize the divine influence in your life. A reminder that wherever you are right now...the divine is within you.

The eagle feather is the most sacred and honoured gift given to an individual. Respect is essential when it comes to eagle feathers. Some people may take eagle feathers from the eagle. It is our right to be able to do so.

What are the 7 Principles of the Eagle?

Here are 7 leadership principles that we can learn from the eagle:

- Eagles fly Alone and at high altitudes. ...
- Eagles have a clear vision. ...
- Eagles do not eat dead things. ...
- Eagles love the storm. ...
- Mating or love play in eagles. ...
- Eagles prepare their young for flight.

"But to swear on an eagle feather has more importance and weight to them." In Native culture, the eagle is sacred because it flies so high that it is the bird that is closest to the Creator. A symbol of spirituality, the eagle feather is used in many Native traditions in North America. In a healing circle, holding it in your hand while speaking implies a solemn commitment to speak the truth. The eagle being the bird that flies the highest, it is considered to be the one that is closest to the Creator, thus becoming a symbol of spiritual elevation. For this reason, its feather is used to push the smoke of tobacco, believing that it helps to bring prayers to the Creator. Giving one is the greatest honorary mark that can be given to a person. Each eagle feather worn by a warrior symbolizes an act of bravery. If a dancer drops an eagle feather during a pow-wow, the entire festival must stop and a special ceremony is conducted by elders so that it is honored and taken in a sacred and respectful way.

The structure of the bird's wings represents sacred knowledge for Native American culture, similar to the cross in Catholic culture.

Since the dawn of time, feathers have been used by shamans to dialogue with the subtle worlds. Now, birds are the inhabitants of the upper world, and their feathers serve to create a link between heaven and earth. For Native Americans, they are a gift from the Great Spirit. They are part of most shamanic healing rituals. In Mesoamerica, wearing a feather headdress was a privilege. They are a symbol of power: a magnificent headdress of turquoise-green quetzal feathers adorned the heads of the Mayan kings and the Aztec emperor during major religious ceremonies: a way of getting closer to the gods. In North America, among the Plains Indians, eagle feathers are worn as headdresses by tribal chiefs and warriors who are valiant in combat, as well as by medicine men.

Shells and feathers guide the flow of energy, while sage or palo santo smoke acts as a natural energetic cleanser. The ritual ends with a blessing or an intention prayer, allowing the experience to integrate and the sacred space to close properly. The entire process offers a deep yet gentle energetic shift, generating harmony, release and a renewed inner presence.

- Use of white sage, palo santo, cedar or resins.

2. Invocation of the Four Elements

- Earth: stones, sand, salt, natural objects.
- Fire: candle or ritual embers.
- · Water: shell, moon water, blessed water.
- Air: feather, incense, smoke.
- Restores elemental balance.

3. Feather Guiding Technique

- Directs smoke and channels intention.
- Used to sweep stagnant energy around the body.

4. Sounds and Vibrations

- Tibetan bowls, abundance bowls, drums, rattles.
- Break blockages and rebalance frequencies.

5. Application of Sacred Essential Oils

- Lavender, rose, eucalyptus, cedar, copal, myrrh.
- Applied on wrists, heart, temples.
- Used for grounding, awakening or calming.

6. Intention Activation

- Spoken or silent declaration.
- Aligns the purpose of the ritual.
- Can focus on healing, abundance, clarity or protection.

7. Use of the Abalone Shell

- · Holds burning herbs and sacred plants.
- Symbolizes water and emotional harmony.
